AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON “WOMEN SAFETY ISSUES AND MEASURES”

On 01.08.2025, the Internal Compliance Committee of GPTC, Vanavasi organized an awareness programme on “Women Safety Issues and Measures” in the college auditorium. The event aimed to educate and sensitize the faculty and students about the pressing issues concerning women’s safety and the preventive measures to ensure a secure environment for all.

Mr. N. JAGADEESAN. The event was graced by Mrs. C. BHARATHIPRIYA, Lecturer in Chemistry/Co-ordinator of the programme, Mrs. N. MANJU, Department of Mechanical Engineering, Dr .S. KIRUTHIKA, HOD-Incharge/ Computer Engineering and Dr. H. SHAHEEN, Lecturer in English. The programme was attended by female faculty members and 156 female students from various departments of our college.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

The programme began with an introductory speech by Mrs. N. MANJU, Department of Mechanical Engineering, who emphasized the importance of safety awareness and the collective responsibility of society in creating a secure environment for women. She highlighted the rising concerns of women’s safety and encouraged students and faculty members to be proactive in addressing these issues. Mrs. C. BHARATHIPRIYA, Lecturer in Chemistry/Co-ordinator of the programme, who delivered an insightful speech on the challenges women face in contemporary society and also discussed practical safety measures, including:

1. Awareness of surroundings
2. Importance of self-defense training
3. Reporting suspicious activities promptly
4. Leveraging safety apps (Kavalan SOS app) and helplines for immediate assistance
5. The role of educational institutions in fostering a safe environment

A discussion session was held, where faculty and students shared their concerns and suggestions. The interactive segment provided valuable insights into the unique challenges faced by students and staff on and off-campus. Students were informed to contact any of the committee members to report for the complaint coming under the purview of the committee.

The event served as a significant step toward building awareness and fostering a culture of women safety and respect within the campus. The awareness programme was well-received by the participants who expressed a deeper understanding of the importance of women's safety. This initiative successfully instilled a sense of responsibility among the faculty members and the students to contribute to a safer and more inclusive environment.
